I [REDACTED] want to go ahead and dock and I forgot to do it when it happened. And I've actually been told about this but I was I walked out it was yeah, it was. It was either [REDACTED] or two days ago, which pretty much it's kind of pointless at this at this time. But I stepped out my house and I was shooting, I was shooting my little, little pellet [REDACTED] I shoot my pellet rifle almost every day because several years ago I [REDACTED] started I started like, shooting and I started shooting actively and routinely because I showed exemplified exemplified some prowess and marksmanship, and so I've been trying to see how far I can push that. My skills and how far how I can practice and you know, I did, I did collegiate tennis so I did, like somebody's professional tennis for several years. And so I know what it takes and so I know it takes almost, you know, daily exposure so I've been trying to get myself that exposure and marksmanship so that's what I was doing. I was going outside with a pillow pellet pistol that I have. It only does 500 feet per second. So it's basically it's less than half the velocity of a 22 caliber round and it's more it's it's more than half the weight. So it's like bait roughly. It's half the velocity and half the weight. So you'd have you know, equivocally you know, you'd have like a quarter of the the lethality of it would be like a quarter so anyway, long short, long story short. I went out there and shooting and I [REDACTED] my neighbor [REDACTED] the young guy in the big [REDACTED] truck. He drove he was you know [REDACTED] came like he normally does is rare and through the down the road and then he came in from a house and he saw me out there shooting and the guy slammed on brakes and I [REDACTED] his tires. Screech as you know, as you know, as a young son on brakes it was really it wasn't screeching sounds more like a grinding sound. Because the tire stop and the rubber the tires actually slid on the asphalt. And he stopped and then he slammed it he slammed his he absolutely [REDACTED] maxed his engine out is [REDACTED] absolutely slammed the drop the drop the hammer, he floored it. He accelerated he turned the throttle all the way up maximum throttle and he burned rubber. And it made this horrific sound because he drives this very loud diesel smoke when everywhere. And that's been something that he's been doing constantly and routinely, you know, is like if he sees us outside he'll stop right in front of us. And then he'll burn out and threatened you know, drag on down the road. So that is you know, like burning out in front of somebody that's like considered to be like, that's like insult so you're sorry, it's like an attempt to intimidate and attempt to threaten and harass. So that happened two days ago. And like so for today. The neighbor burned all day today. All these woods and stuff that he

was supposed to have grant you know, have grinded and left. He collected together and then he burned it all off today. I didn't know whether it was whether we could still burn or not. And then a couple minutes ago, guess what? It's midnight. Couple minutes ago I'm walking outside the winds kind of picked up and he's got an open flame so he hasn't visibly open flame from the road which you know, violate several fire codes. And it looks like the fire which is getting bigger and bigger and bigger. So it looks like he didn't put out the fire. Well, he didn't do a good [REDACTED] putting it out. So I'm gonna have to keep an eye on that to make sure the forest doesn't burn down. [REDACTED] people are [REDACTED] they're [REDACTED] [REDACTED] as destructive as they can be. So I wanted to remark to note to make note about the about those two things that have been occurring and there was something else that I wanted to make a note of that it's [REDACTED] outrageous. You know, it's like anytime they see us outside, they slam on their brakes and they stop and stare at us. Which is not cool. And we don't understand what their problem is. We don't understand what their hostility is coming from we don't know these people we don't know nothing.

But yeah, oh, the other thing that I kind of needed to document is that it's been like almost two or three weeks. It's been about three weeks since I since I've received a phone call from the [REDACTED] Department Natural Resources Environmental Protection Department [REDACTED] my complaints about you know, the lack of erosion protection and everything else. I've also sent an email to the head guy and informing him of a drainage point located on their property. That is that was actually dug by the county that allows my property to to drain off water. So all my property there's there's I have a ditch a ditch that goes a drainage ditch, it goes through my property and all the water fills up, you know, comes into this ditch and then it goes down it goes down, goes to the road, goes underneath the road and through his property. And so what did he do? He used a skid steer and a user set the skid steer or front loader to push dirt over that and to smooth that area out. So he got he basically covered up his portion of the drainage ditch which will mean my property will not be able to drain properly, appropriately and will flood. So I said I'd send photos of that as some evidence to that to the EPA guy. I wrote to him because he said local authority is up to it. Or the local authority is [REDACTED] is a shoe said that they're the only cleared one acre Well I went out there and measured it. I went out. I actually didn't go anywhere. I went on to Google Maps. I know it was wider than than an acre went onto Google Maps. Use their calculation tool. And it's well over an acre and a half, which even if the Google Maps isn't quite exactly accurate, it's going to be accurate, but it's not going to be accurate by maybe a couple of feet. It's not gonna be off by 1000s You know, 100 or, or 1000 [REDACTED] So definitely cleared out more land in the head than their permits allowed them to. And she's not going to do anything. She hasn't responded. DNR has not responded I'm stuck. You know, they're [REDACTED] they're sol, sol Sol. I'm really upset about that. Because that means that basically they can do anything they want. They can't get anything. They can do anything they want, and no one's gonna stop them and they can run everything is what they want. And no one's gonna stop them. So there you go.
